

# MY Y. YOUR Y.

## Overview of the Y's Reciprocity Program

The Y is for all. At the Y, we want everyone who comes through our doors to feel welcome and included and to know that they belong to a charitable cause that transforms lives. The Reciprocity Program gives us another opportunity to demonstrate our commitment to these principles. We want our members to feel that, through Reciprocity, they're not going to different Ys but to their Ys—wherever they may be. The Reciprocity Program gives YMCA of West Central Illinois and YMCA of Hannibal members access to participating YMCAs in the tri-state region, at no extra charge. Some restrictions and exclusions may apply. We encourage you to contact your local Y for more information.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### Who is eligible to participate in the program?

My Y. Your Y. is for active full facility/full privilege members of the YMCA of West Central Illinois Association and the YMCA of Hannibal Association. Y members must maintain an active full facility/full privilege membership at their home Y and visit their home Y more frequently than the host Y. Members should check for restrictions prior to visiting the host Y.

### How do I get started?

YMCA members that want to visit another YMCA, simply present their membership card and valid drivers license to the Y facility and complete necessary paperwork.

### Is there a limit to the number of times that I can use another YMCA?

Yes. Members must use their home branch (where they pay dues) 50% or more of the time. Visits are tracked at each YMCA. In the event that you have exhausted this frequency, Y staff will discuss options with you.

### Does this benefit cost me more in my membership?

No. The My Y. Your Y. is a value-added benefit for Y members in the YMCA of West Central Illinois Association and the YMCA of Hannibal Association.

### Does this replace the AWAY (Always Welcome at the YMCA) program?

No. The AWAY program still exists for members who belong to a Y outside of the YMCA of West Central Illinois and YMCA of Hannibal Associations. Y members of both Associations may also use the AWAY program when visiting Ys outside the two Associations.

### Why do some Y's not participate in the Reciprocity Program?

As each YMCA is operated independently, participation is at the discretion of each organization's leadership. Future Y's are to be added state and nationwide.
